June was an important month in the fight against Human Trafficking with a 30-year sentence for R. Kelly in one case and Ghislane Maxwell sentence of 20 years for her role in another case. The outcomes are sure to bring more attention to not only to the topic Human Trafficking but also how cases are heard and their outcome. Also in June — an INTERPOL-Led crackdown on the criminal groups behind Human Trafficking and Migrant Smuggling has lead to the rescue of nearly 700 victims in 44 countries. However, those in Texas suffered a different fate with at least 53 migrants losing their lives. So far 4 have been arrested in that case.

News of the U.S. Supreme Court's decision to overturn Roe v. Wade was headlining media during the month of June, too.

ZI joined the UN and global community in recognizing the International Day for the Elimination of Sexual Violence (June 19<sup>th</sup>).

Last month NPRC Scholarship Winner Savannah Nichols was our guest and told us about her studies and plans.


A reminder that Summer Surprise is approaching – Thursday, July 14<sup>th</sup>, 5:30pm – more information coming soon!

- Develop partnerships/collaborations with other civil society organizations who are active in working to eliminate trafficking in persons.
