ELEVATOR SPEECH


The Zonta Club of Warren honors, empowers and advocates for women, both locally and globally, seeking to end domestic and gender-based violence, human trafficking and poverty through service and education programs.

Child marriage notes from Fraidy Reiss author of *Unchained at Last*.

During the Fall virtual Zonta conference, Fraidy was a speaker. As a raised strict orthodox Jewish girl, at 15 years old she was part of an arranged marriage and at 19 was married by a match maker. After days of abuse, with no identity, money, or self-esteem, she began seeking PFA (protection from abuse) in her late 20s, and it took 5 more years to get a order. She was shun from her family including relatives, friends and church. Throughout her story she empathized the importance of support by others to leave a "chained marriage / forced marriage." Zonta was praised for a mission to stop child marriages. She sited DE, NJ, PA, MN, RI and NY as having legislation to help end such marriages. Her organization - "Unchained at Last" was founded in 2011 and as a web page. A recommended movie/documentary is "Mrs. America" which emphasized equal rights for women including marital rights.

A recent email from National Zonta has global statistics. Fraidy says in the USA there are estimated 300,000 women in forced / child marriages. It was through online education from Rutgers University that Fraidy received her degrees and was able to have her children returned, a career and see success in life. Education is the key to encouraged women to see themselves as viable humans and reminded Zontians to think not only worldwide, but also the US on this childhood marriage.


