American's Silent Culture Human Trafficking Part I

This information is from Deputy Elizabeth Fides of Erie Co NY. – the speaker at International Women's Day on March.7th, sponsored by Jamestown Zonta, AAUW, and JCC. edit by Phyllis Wright.

The "Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act of 2003" renews the government's comment to identifying and assisting victims. It encourages state and local law enforcement agencies to participate in the detection in investigation of Domestic Sex Trafficking cases.

It is "American Silent Culture." Purchasing is done through internet, word of mouth, and local new papers. It thrives because society looks at human traffic victims as prostitutes, and not as victims.

 293,000 - American citizens are at risk becoming human traffic victims.

- 50% victims classified as runaway youth living on the street
- 55% approx. number of street girls who become entangled in prostitution networks
- 75% girls entangled in prostitution networks controlled by a sex trafficker
- 12-14 average age girls trafficked for sex are first victimized

It's a rich man's came on the poor!

Human trafficking is now the fastest growing criminal industry. It is the second largest income generating syndicated in the world, (second to the drugs and arms trade) generating \$101 billion annually.
